Camp Tuck is held at Camp Whitcomb/Mason, a Boys and Girls Club Camp, located just 30 miles west of Milwaukee on Lake Keesus near Hartland, Wisconsin.

Camp facilities include a dining hall, cabins, indoor showers and wash rooms, infirmary, craft shop, swimming pool, sports fields, archery range, dock and campfire amphitheater.

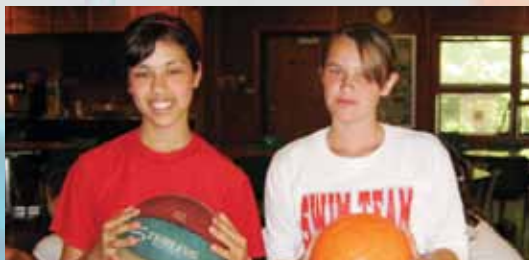

Camp Tuck is a fun-filled summer camp for girls entering grades 6-8. A specific aim of the camp is to encourage and develop the virtues necessary for becoming a positive influence on family, friends and society. Inspired by the Christian understanding of the person, the program teaches the virtues of cheerfulness, generosity and diligence, encouraging genuine femininity while helping each girl to be an authentic leader serving others.

Camp Tuck is a unique one week program of character building, sports, recreation and the arts. In an environment of trust and adventure, it offers a well-rounded, well-organized, fast paced curriculum and the personal attention of a dedicated staff.



Sports and Recreation

The sports program fosters the qualities of generosity, perseverance and sportsmanship. Sports include swimming, canoeing, paddle boating, soccer, hiking, volleyball, relay races, treasure hunts and more!

Leadership Talks

Every day counselors give a brief talk on some practical ways the girls can become more effective leaders. Topics include personal responsibility, loyalty, friendship, fortitude and respect for self and others.



Projects in the Arts

Projects are designed to develop skills, foster creativity and increase self-confidence, industriousness, patience and attention to detail. Arts and crafts, dance and drama are offered.

Spiritual Dimension

The staff of Camp Tuck believes that every child has a body, soul, mind and heart, and that camp activities should address the needs of the whole person. Christian ideals are fostered through the camp experience, and daily Mass is available for those wishing to attend. A priest of Opus Dei serves as chaplain.
